

Wayland Township Board Meeting

August 6, 2018,

6:30 p.m.

Supervisor VanVolkinburg called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance was led by Treasurer Kamyszek

Roll Call: VanVolkinburg, Miner, Kamyszek, Stein and McInerney

Stein made a motion to approve the Minutes from July 2, and tonight's agenda, with support from Kamyszek. All yes, motion carried.

Audience Members: Judge William Baillargeon gave the Annual Report for Allegan County Courts and the Specialty Courts. Shane Vandenberg, YS Twp Trustee shared that an employee of GLASA was running for a YS Twp Trustee position. Michael Villar introduced himself and shared he was running for Allegan County Prosecutor.

Audience Members Not on the Agenda: Doug Knobloch, Seymour Drive @ Selkirk Lake asked questions about the sewer pipes in the ground at the campground (Brown Ranger) and who was permitting. VanVolkinburg responded and Healey will email VanVolkinburg names and an email from the Health Dept. and DEQ. Sandra Hoffbeck, neighbor on Selkirk Lake also commented. Request that VanVolkinburg contact the Health Dept & DEQ; he will contact them and will try and get everyone together for a meeting.

Planning Commission Report: Miner reported on the July 11 meeting. Scharphorn Jr. , came to the meeting and emails will be a form of communication so no longer a 'he said, she said' situation from residents who talk to PCI. September 10, will be the 63 day period for the Master Plan shared with neighboring municipalities. Subdivision Ordinance was discussed, see below under New Business. Outdoor Gathering Ordinance still in process. Discussed that if testing water (Health Dept) residents should be able to ask what to test for or what is being tested for. Concerns with the Sunrise Landfill on Gregorville Road.

Sheriff/Deputy Report -Deputy Anderson reported that nothing violent had been happening, but they have been busy. Asked about firework questions and our noise ordinance. Discussed the Data Master Breathalyzer and how it would be very beneficial on this side of the County.

Unfinished Business – PCI Update/Invoice discussed. The blight addresses not changed will be noted and shared with PCI. VanVolkinburg discussed.

Addorio web design is slowing down as Davidson recuperates. Kamyszek will be taking photos.

Discussed memorial trees and plaques for Montague & Staley. A planting ceremony will take place on October 8, at 6:00 p.m. prior to the monthly meeting.

Annual Audit was conducted August 1 & 2, McInerney & Kamyszek were present to answer questions, etc. They suggested some changes that will be implemented. Completed audit will arrive in a couple months.

1180 128th mowing – Discussed Stein brush hog the property. – NOTE: next day talked to Blue Line Excavating and they will give us a quote.

131st Avenue Road Update – VanVolkinburg and Larry Brenner (Road Committee in audience) discussed. Brenner will contact them as a 'tax payer.'

Great Lakes Energy (True Stream) – Internet Options via Great Lakes Energy discussed – McInerney will email those interested and share on website. Board will sign a letter asking for Wayland Township as the next site.

New Business – Hill Cemetery – Title Search/Survey (now Louwaanar property) progressing – McInerney
Consumers Energy conversion of lights – McInerney discussed and made a motion to convert all lights as stated on the CE Conversion of Mercury Vapor Streetlights and High Pressure Sodium Cobrahead to LED, Kamyszek provided support, Roll Call vote – all yes, motion carried.

Cost Recovery Ordinance - VanVolkinburg needs to get together again with the City Manager. At this time no liens will be processed.

GLASA Cost Increase Ordinance was reviewed with a sample copy and will be an item to vote on in September.

Sub Division Ordinance – 03-2018 – Ordinance to provide regulations for the subdivision of land. Motion to support Sub Division Ordinance 003-2018 made by Stein with support from Kamyszek. All yes, motion carried

Approval and Review of bills –Bills needing to be approved list and Balance Sheet provided by McInerney. Miner made a motion to approve the bills as submitted and Stein provided support. Roll call vote, all yes, motion carried.

Communication – Call/Complaint regarding continual yard sale(s) just north of Bradley shared by McInerney. Discussed. Duration is 3 days via # 3.15. VanVolkinburg will get with PCI, Deputies available to attend, if necessary.

Ramp to Offices – Kamyszek & McInerney shared they felt a handicap ramp was needed at our front door.

McInerney will get with Fifelski for a quote.

Department of Ag – Scholten Farms letter was shared by McInerney

Charter channel changes was shared

Active Shooter Training provided by Wayland Chamber was attended by McInerney – info and flyers shared.

Notary Update – Both Kamyszek & McInerney are now Notaries
