

Wayland Township Board Meeting  
April 4, 2016  
6:30 p.m.

Meeting was called to order by Supervisor VanVolkinburg at 6:30 p.m. Pledge of Allegiance was led by Trustee Staley. Roll Call vote: All present.

A motion was made by Staley to approve the minutes from the March 7, 2016 board meeting and budget hearing, support provided by Kamyszek. All yes, motion passed.

A motion was made by Kamyszek to approve the agenda for tonight's meeting. Support was provided by Staley. All yes, motion passed.

Audience Members – none

County Commissioner Report – Commissioner Black presented his report

Planning Commission Report – Staley reported that they were working on marijuana situations. There is also a ZBA variance coming up and a public hearing will be held April 13, regarding property at 2902 10<sup>th</sup> Street. Request to change property from Commercial to R2-Residential.

Sheriff-Deputy Report – March had 67 incidents.

Unfinished Business - Water/Sewer – VanVolkinburg reported he had talked to the tribe lawyer and BOIA has made it easier regarding easements and it is not necessary to obtain them prior to the property going into trust.

PCI Update – VanNortwick ZBA Variance, 2902 10<sup>th</sup> Street Rezone, and 947 124<sup>th</sup> Blight and 491 126<sup>th</sup> Avenue civil infractions citation with continued blight. New complaints reported on – 129<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 10<sup>th</sup> Street. VanVolkinburg will review the new complaints.

Partnering/Recreation Committee- Staley stated nothing new.

Township Sign – Kamyszek presented the electric quote for the proposed new township sign. Will look at the budget and discuss in May.

Farmer request @ Haywood Property; VanVolkinburg is still discussing to see if this can work for both parties.

New Business – Resolution 07-2016 Monthly Budget Adjustment/Correction, last fiscal month with adjustments/reports. Motion by Staley with support from Stein, roll call vote all yes, motion carried.

McInerney discussed the possibility of signing up with Verizon for emergency phones as part of a discussion regarding better Verizon service within the township. Board was in agreement to see what options Verizon had for residents without 'signing up.'

Bills were presented for approval. Motion made by Kamyszek to pay the bills as presented. Support provided by Stein. Roll call vote, all yes, motion carried.

Communication – Supervisor VanVolkinburg reported he received two information pieces from the Allegan County Drain Commission: Norris Drain and the McIntyre Lake drain are both to be cleaned.

Board Comments: McNerney shared the 2016 Presidential Primary had 827 voters out of 2344. In 2012 less than 400 voters cast votes in the Presidential Primary. We will be reimbursed by the SOM/BOE for this election. McNerney also thanked the board for supporting her attendance of the MAMC Conference. This was her third and final year and she is eligible for a Clerk Certification.

VanVolkinburg, Kamyszek, Stein and Staley did not have any comments.
