## Wayland Township Board Meeting Minutes - 6:30 p.m. - October 4, 2021

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Supervisor VanVolkinburg.

Pledge of Allegiance was led by Treasurer Kamyszek.

Roll Call: VanVolkinburg, McInerney, Kamyszek, Miner & Stein

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> from September 7, board meeting was motioned by Trustee Miner with support from Trustee Stein. All yes, motion carried.

<u>Approval of agenda</u> for tonight's meeting, by Kamyszek and support from Miner. All yes, motion carried.

<u>Audience Members</u> – Ron Devries spoke about wanting a No Jake braking sign and asked about an Ordinance requesting change in speed limit and other issues on 129<sup>th</sup> Avenue. DeVries also discussed water issues near his home and in Wayland Township. Suggested a spot engineer review be explored. Commissioner Cain discussed the water study done by Allegan County via a grant recently. Nitrates have been found in areas of Wayland and Martin Townships.

<u>County Commissioner Report</u> – Rick Cain discussed the new mandate stating as locals wanted. Budget is ready and redistricting will change number of commissioners from 7 to 5 members next year when elections occur.

<u>Planning Commission Report</u> – Miner shared discussions at their September 8 meeting. Rezone request from Hendershott/Potter decided to not move forward and we are waiting for their official withdrawal. Dan Burrill from Grandview Estates returned and wants to move forward.

<u>Sheriff Deputy Report</u> – Deputy Baker (arrived later) reported that things have been going well. Situation with a homicide out of Grand Rapids with a pursuit that ended on 129<sup>th</sup> and Patterson. Anderson was involved along with the MSP, Tribal and City; great teamwork by all. Daisy Mae 2.0 situation is civil. MSP and most police agencies are short staffed. Discussed speed limit signs, etc. for 129<sup>th</sup> Avenue as requested by DeVries above.

<u>Cemetery Report</u>- Micah Kuhtic not in attendance. McInerney shared cemetery staff had been busy with burials, mowing and finishing foundations. McInerney worked with the Missing in America group and a civil war's veteran's wife's cremains has been received and will be buried with her husband.

<u>WAEMS Report-</u> Sue Kamyszek attended the 9/8 meeting. Township stats for use were 38 in July and 36 in August. Six grants have been received.

Unfinished Business – PCI - no report received.

- \*Chart of Accounts Project with BSA/State of Michigan continues McInerney continues sending information to continue process.
- \*American Rescue Plan forms are still pending on the site. MTA continues to provide information regarding ARPA uses, etc.
- \*Asphalt Driveway bid/info Kamyszek/McInerney –discussed in September, tabled until Budget time
- \*Township Sign change to digital Kamyszek/McInerney Table for other bids.
- \*Joint Meeting of the Board and the Planning Commission Wednesday, 10/20 @ 6:30 p.m.

\*Ordinance O-02-2021 - Noxious Weed Ordinance – McInerney emailed explanation from Attorney Seeber on 9/16. Discussed. McInerney motioned to approve Ordinance O-02-2021, Kamyszek provided support. Roll call vote, VanVolkinburg, McInerney, Kamyszek, and Stein – Yes. Miner – No. Motion carried.

<u>New Business</u> – Revised Addorio Bid for Server/Email/Office 365 (previously approved with budget) was presented by McInerney. McInerney also shared an MAMC Conference in late November she will be attending.

<u>Resolution –R-10-2021</u> – Budget Review. Discussed Resolution required quarterly. Motion to adopt was made by Kamyszek with support from VanVolkinburg. Roll call vote, all yes, motion carried.

<u>Approval and Review of bills</u> – Bill packet was presented and discussed. Following discussion VanVolkinburg motioned to pay the bills with support from Miner. Roll Call vote, all yes, motion carried.

<u>Communication</u> -\* Semi-Annual Report from Resource Recovery Program for 2021 emailed \*Policy Change from Insurance –

<u>Board Comments</u> – *Miner* – frustrated that Township found out via online who the new Wayland Fire Chief was. Wayland Township provides close to 60% of their budget. Full time fire fighter still being sought.

*Kamyszek* – shared an online article of sod drags in the township. Is an SUP needed? *VanVolkinburg* – Discussed that he and McInerney have checked with others regarding planners. He will contact two companies and bring the information/names to the Joint Meeting. *Stein* – Keeps being hopeful for TrueStream.

McInerney agreed with Stein and is excited for the township.

VanVolkinburg made a motion to adjourn with support from Minor. Meeting adjourned at 7:56 p.m.
