Meeting called to order by Supervisor VanVolkinburg at 6:30 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance was led by Trustee Stein.

Roll Call: Present - Roger VanVolkinburg, Matt Miner, Sue Kamyszek, Jim Stein and Ann McInerney

Approval of February 11, meeting minutes for budget hearing, regular board meeting and closed session began with a motion from Miner and second from Miner. All yes, motion carried.

Approval of tonight's agenda was one minor change made with a motion from Stein and second from Kamyszek. All yes, motion carried.

<u>Audience</u>: Scott Nightengale thanked members for the TrueStream information he received. Asked about the sand pile at Selkirk Lake. VanVolkinburg reported; the intent is to now move the sand, not cover the pile.

<u>County Commissioner Report</u> – Rick Cain reported things were going well, again discussed the Headlee Override may occur in 2020 election. County now shares a public defense attorney with VanBuren County.
