

Options for Voter Registration (or Updating Address):

Those who have a valid Michigan Driver's License or State ID, can register at mi.gov/vote

- or -

Register by mail: Applications are available on the Township website

- or -

Register in person at the Clerk's office

Voter Registration Deadlines:

Online or by mail

Up to 15 days before election

In person at the Clerk's office

Through election day (proof of residency required during last 14 days)

What's on the ballot?

Beginning a month before election day, voters can preview their ballot at mi.gov/vote or pick up a sample ballot at the Clerk's office.

VOTING METHOD #1

ABSENTEE

Any registered voter can vote with an absentee ballot.

There are 2 steps to this process:

1) Submit a ballot application

(unless you have previously submitted a permanent ballot application)

2) Return your voted ballot

by mail or absentee ballot drop box

BALLOT MUST ARRIVE AT CLERK'S OFFICE BEFORE 8:00 P.M. ON ELECTION DAY

Absentee Application Options:

- Online at mi.gov/vote
- Request from the Clerk's office
- Visit the Clerk's office

Returning your ballot to the Township in person, or using the drop box, is strongly recommended instead of mailing - especially in the last week before the election.

THE OUTSIDE OF THE BALLOT ENVELOPE MUST BE SIGNED BY VOTER!
